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Starting in April, twenty-one British towns set out on the Eurovision glory trail in the 1979 round of Europe's top fun show. Jeux Sans Frontieres. And by the end of the year, an estimated 240 million viewers throughout Europe will have shared in the fun and competition.

But first there's the hurdle of winning at home - taking part in BBC 1's ever-popular It's A Knockout.

Three towns take part in each of seven "domestic" competitions with the winners going into Europe to take on teams from Belgium, France, Germany, Italy, Switzerland, Yugoslavia and, for the first time in the 13 year history of the competition, Portugal.

The winners of each programme will go forward to a special It's A Championship Knockout to be staged at Charnock Richard, near Chorley in Lancashire in July and will compete for the Radio Times trophy designed by Bill Tidy, which they will retain for a year along with the British Champions Title.

And, of course, each winning team will go into Europe with the highest placed team representing their country in the Grand Final to be held in Bordeaux, France, later in the year. In the event of a tie for highest place, the team which scored the most points in their heat will represent the UK.

There will also be another It's A Celebrity Knockout programme where the Lord's Taverners and a team of celebrities will battle it out - strictly for fun!

The series commences on Sunday, April 8, with teams from Arun and South Wight travelling to Bournemouth to take on the home team on the Pier Approach.

Then on Easter Monday, April 16, at the Mill Meadow Recreation Ground, Henley-on-Thames, the home team take on visitors Didcot and Rushmoor.

A fortnight later on Sunday, April 29, Great Yarmouth play host to North Walsham and Norwich at the Wellesley Recreation Ground.

On Sunday, May 6, in the shadow of Lambeth Palace at the Archbishop's Park, the Borough of Lambeth take on teams from Hounslow and Kingston-upon-Thames.

And the following week, on Sunday May 13, the setting for the fifth heat is in the grounds of historic Dudley Castle when the home team take on Bridgnorth and Worcester.

On Sunday, May 20, as Knockout's contribution to the Isle of Man's millenium celebrations, Castletown play host to visitors from Douglas and Ramsey in the grounds of King William's College.

And the final heat of 1979's It's A Knockout will be played on Sunday, June 17 at the Market Street Athletic Ground, Bury, when the host team are taking on local rivals Blackburn and Salford.

The winners of the first heat at Bournemouth will go to Switzerland as the UK's first Jeux Sans Frontieres team of 1979 with the winners at Henley-on-Thames going to France, the winners from Great Yarmouth going to Yugoslavia, the winners from Dudley going to Italy, the winners from Lambeth going to Belgium, the winners from the Isle of Man going to Germany, and the winners of the final, all-Lancashire clash going as the UK's first Knockout team in Portugal.

There will also be a British heat of Jeux Sans Frontieres at the Westminster Lodge Arena, St. Albans with the host town representing the UK, and that will be held on Wednesday, August 22.

An integral part of the atmosphere and unique style of Knockout, Eddie Waring and Stuart Hall will be returning as commentators with former international soccer referee Arthur Ellis as senior referee.

STUART HALL

Stuart Hall, who made his Knockout debut in 1972, presents "Look North", the BBC North West week-night television magazine programme in Manchester, and makes frequent appearances on the network in "Nationwide".

A Lancashire lad, he first broadcast in 1958 as a radio contributor in "Sports Spotlight". He has reported on soccer, cricket, tennis, motor racing as well as current affairs.

His great loves are football, fast cars and antique clocks. Perhaps the clocks reign supreme - he loves their sense of continuity.

Married the same year he started broadcasting - 1958 - Stuart has two teenage children, Francesca and Daniel. His home in Glossop, Derbyshire, is crammed with antique clocks, Victorian furniture, bronzes and old portraits.



EDDIE WARING

Eddie joined the programme in 1966 and has vast experience of "Knockout" recordings.

He has been a top BBC personality ever since TV came to the North in 1951, becoming a household name in covering rugby league.

Born in Dewsbury, Eddie played soccer, rugby union and rugby league.

A globe-trotter, he has made seven trips round the world and appeared on TV in Australia, New Zealand and the U.S.

Eddie usually gives a special blow-by-blow account of the mini-marathon contest, which can be a vital tie-breaker in a tight contest.



THE REFEREES

Arthur Ellis, from Halifax, will again be Senior Referee. He has officiated in practically every country that plays first-class football.

He refereed World Cup ties and 73 internationals in his time, and became the first English referee to be awarded the Gold Badge of FIFA. He now works as a brewery representative.

Arthur will be assisted as usual by Mike Swann who has experienced Knockout from both sides of the fence, starting his association with the programme as Manager of the Banbury team of 1972.



CECIL KORER

Producer

Cecil, who has been with the BBC for 22 years, began his television career in the north. He then moved to London to work as director on such shows as *Top of the Pops* and *Children Talking*. He became Executive Producer of BBC television's Quiz Unit and was responsible for the development and production of such quiz series as *Password* and *Ask the Family*.

In 1975 he returned north - he was born in Stockport - to take over *It's A Knockout* and *Jeux Sans Frontieres*.

In the past year he has been advising television companies in Hong Kong and America about producing *Knockout* programmes in their own countries.



Out of sight of the TV audience there's a dedicated team that the *Knockout* live audiences see going about their complex duties.

The director is Geoff Wilson. Engineering manager Geoff Lomas ensures that all the complicated equipment functions correctly. Cecil also has the assistance of Alan Wright and Alan Walsh, who lead the full-time workers responsible for the months of advance preparation which go into the smooth running of the series.

The games are devised and designed by Stuart Furber and his assistant Barry Roach. Stuart has been designer on and off for over 10 years and his outrageous games and costumes have provided much of the fun and zany humour for which *Knockout* has become so well known.

The Scoregirls



Maria Scott (left), Helene Hunt (Centre) and Debra Windass (right) are the three scoregirls for this year's competition.

It's the first time Maria had done the job. This 24 year old model and beautician lives at Mossley in Lancashire, though she was born within the precincts of Hampton Court.

Helene Hunt - who's 21 - has been involved with *It's A Knockout* before - taking on the role of scoregirl at last year's *It's A Celebrity Knockout* and *It's A Championship Knockout*. A model, she now lives near Neston, Wirral, after spending ten years of her life in Australia.

Debra Windass is the youngest member of the line-up (she's 20). She appeared as a *Knockout* scoregirl last year. Born and bred in Hull, she's a medical secretary and also does some modelling. Debra was a member of the Beverley team in the 1977 *It's A Knockout*.

MARATHON: KICK & DUCK

GAME No.1:

BIKE BALL

1 heat of 3 teams

1 male / 1 female

Each team is supplied with a motor bike.

The game is, for the men to dribble a number of large balls along the course using the motorbike.

At the end of the course will be a ramp and hoop through which the ball must pass to complete the run.

Only the nudge bar on the front of the bike may be used to guide the ball.

Having pushed a ball through the hoop at the end of the course, the competitors return to the start and collect another ball.

The team completing the given number of runs in the quickest time will be the winners.

GAME No. 2:

DRUM BALANCE

2 heats of 2 teams

2 male / 1 female

The object of the game is to complete the obstacle course whilst carrying a column of drums.

The girl begins the game and hands over the column to the first man who adds a number of drums to the base of the column. He completes his section of the course and then hands over to the second man, who after adding a similar number of drums, completes the course.

If the drums are dropped, they must be restacked before continuing.

All the obstacles must be negotiated with the column of drums intact.

The team completing the course in the shortest time will be the winners.

GAME No. 3:

LADDER CLIMB

1 heat of 2 teams

2 males / 2 females

By using the ladder provided, all the obstacles must be negotiated by the four competitors.

For obstacle No. 1, all competitors must be inside the rungs of the ladder.

For obstacle No. 2, the competitors must bridge the frame with the ladder from one end and cross from that end.

For obstacle No. 3, the competitors may bridge the frame with the ladder as they are able, but all competitors must cross the frame without touching the ground.

For obstacle No. 4, as many people as required may hold the ladder, but only one person climbs the ladder to place the ball in the holder to complete the game.

The team completing the game in the shorter time will be the winners.

GAME No. 4:

WIRE BALANCE

3 heats of 3 teams

2 males

The game is to burst the hanging balloons.

To do this the two men must remain and balance on the wires.

They may burst the balloons as they wish, but should they fall from the wire whilst doing so, that balloon will not count.

The wire bonds will become wider to the finish.

Should the competitors fall, they must remount the bonds in the same position.

The team bursting the greater number of balloons in the time allowed will be the winners.

GAME No. 5:

'THE CONKS'

1 heat of 3 teams

2 males

One competitor from each team competes at a time.

The object of the game is to collect water from the far end of the course and return as much as possible to the start.

To reach the far end, "The Conks" must pass under a number of barriers. The only way they can achieve this is by lifting the barrier with their noses.

When the first competitor returns to the start, the second goes.

The competitors must negotiate the obstacles on the return run.

The winning team will be the one that collects the largest amount of water in the time allowed.

GAME No. 6:

BASKET BALL

3 heats of 3 teams

4 males / 2 females

Teams A and B play against each other with team C defending etc. The object of the game is for the competitors to pass the ball as quickly as possible from one to another to enable the final man to score.

Any ball dropped is lost.

The man on the trampoline will be wearing a large costume.

The team scoring the given number of goals in the shortest time will be the winners.

(The draw will be made on site and the teams will play accordingly for each heat).

GAME No. 7:

HOOP-LA

1 heat of 2 teams

2 males

A number of tyres will be stacked in a column over a pole. The game is for the competitors to remove the tyres from that pole and to replace them over a second pole in the correct order.

The team completing the game in the shortest time will be the winners.

GAME No. 8:

WATER JUMP

1 heat of 3 teams
4 males / 2 females

The game is to reach the end float using the stepping stones.

All the floats will be anchored but the small ones will be very unstable.

Any competitor falling into the water must return to the start and attempt another run.

The team successfully getting all six members on the large float in the shortest time will be the winners.

GAME No. 9:

UP AND OVER

1 heat of 3 teams
3 males / 1 female

All three teams compete in the game - one competitor from each team at a time.

The competitors must first climb the net and place the ball in the hoop above.

Having climbed over the top of the net they re-collect the ball and drop onto the slide.

The slide will be an inflated airbed at the base of which will be a pool filled with foam.

They must negotiate the slide and pool with the ball they have collected and place same into the the container at the end of the course.

The second competitor cannot proceed until the first has completed the course.

If a ball is dropped and rolls into the pool, it is up to the competitor to decide whether to try and find the ball or count it lost.

Any ball rolling off the airbed will not be counted.

All competitors must pass through the pool.

The winning team will be the one placing the greatest number of balls into the container in the time allowed.

MARATHON:

KICK & DUCK

4 males / 2 females

The teams play against each other.

Team A scores, Team B swings the punch bags and defends the goal.

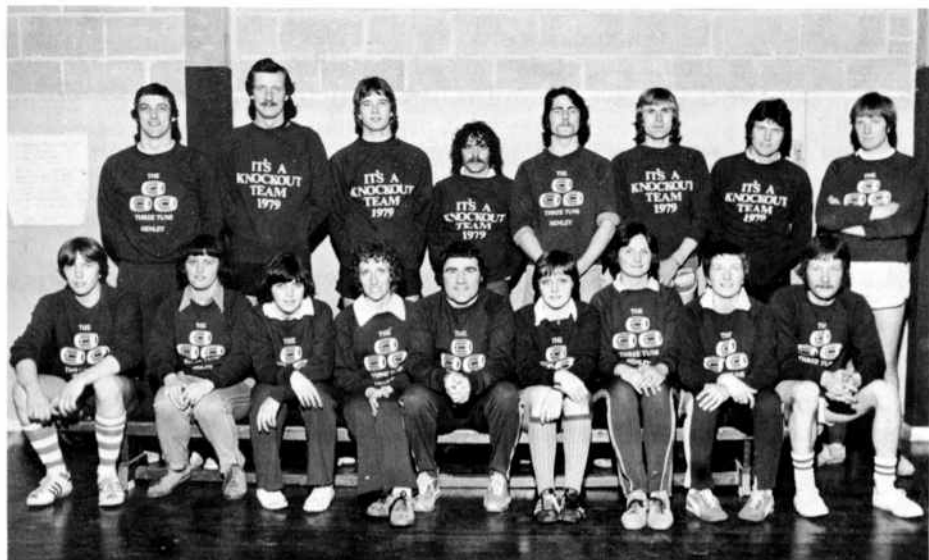
The girl defending the goal will be wearing large boots.

The pushers must remain behind the given line when pushing.

The competitor dribbling the football must remain on the ramp with the ball. If he or the ball leaves the ramp, he must try again.

The winning team will be the one to score the greatest number of goals.

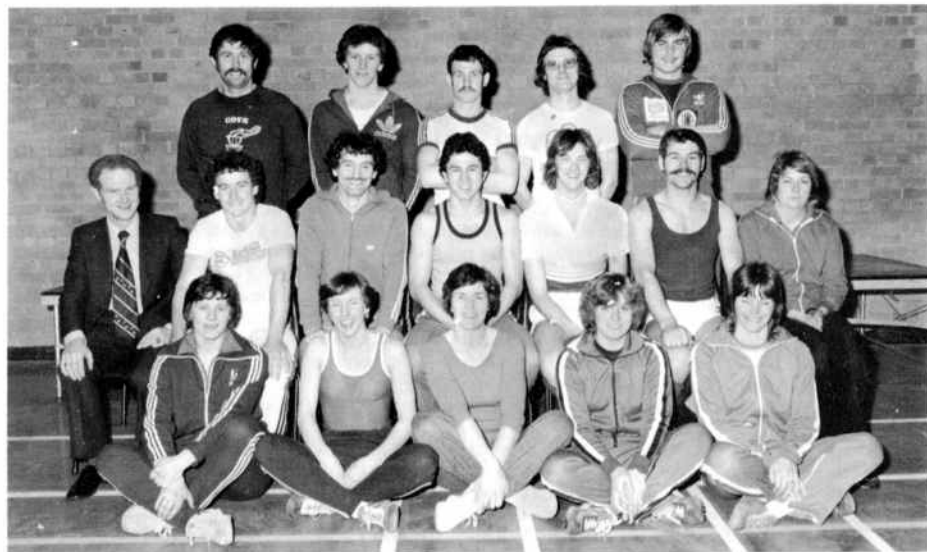

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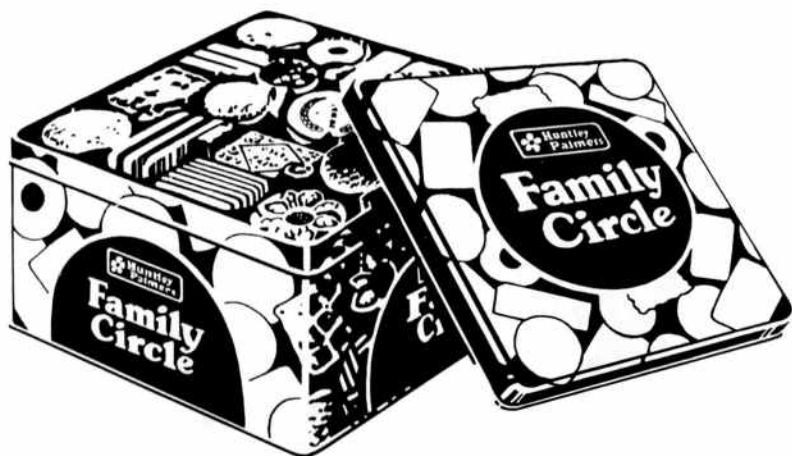
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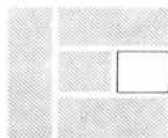
